



Poster Sessions: How it will work

The Poster Sessions are a new addition to the programme at this year's *Digital Evolution: Building a digital nation* conference. At these sessions, delegates will have the chance to give a presentation on a topic that interests them.

Depending on demand, we would like to run at least 10 different poster sessions, spread throughout the venue. Each presenter will run their session 3 times (15 minutes each time) during the allocated poster session. We will announce the end of each session over the tannoy, and other delegates will be free to move amongst the different sessions as they wish.

If you're interested in running a poster session, you'll need to submit your idea to us by Friday 30 October. We'll take a look at all the submissions, and choose the ones that we think are the most relevant to our delegates. If you've been chosen to run a poster session, we will let you know by Wednesday 11 November, giving you plenty of time to prepare your presentation.

Selected presenters will be asked to bring along an A3 piece of paper (your poster!) that you can present and discuss. Posters should:

- Attract attention, provide a brief but focussed overview, and initiate discussion
- Limit the use of text (you do not need full sentences; consider the use of bullet points and key phrases)
- Use good graphics (simple and clear drawings, photos, charts or tables - imagine making a picture of your work)
- Be self-explanatory, with graphics labelled as needed and text providing your major "take home message"
- Have content visible from six feet away

ALL delegates at the conference are invited to present, so you may even see some presentations from Tinder Foundation staff and our partners.

At the end of the conference, we'll ask delegates to vote for the best Poster Session, with the winner receiving a fantastic prize! Delivering a Poster Session will also give you the opportunity to get your idea out to a wide range of people, and to gather lots of feedback.
